How to Apply?

This allows them to meet leaders from other Chemical Engineering Student Societies across Canada, allowing them to bring back ideas that will help enrich the student life!

Four seats are reserved for last year's Hatch Plant Design Competition winners who will be presenting their design at the conference.

Five students will be selected through the Robert G. Auld and Reg Friesen Competitions. The top applicants per competition will be selected to participate in the conference.

Additionally, this year there are 3 spots available for students who would like to attend the conference but not compete in the oral competitions.
